Upcoming Events

Man/Sask Camp

Team Saskatchewan is gearing up to head to Manitoba for the second of two regional camps held this dryland season. The first camp, held in Saskatchewan at QVN, brought together 20 athletes. The second camp, which will be held in Winnipeg, MB and Kenora, ON from September 29 to October 1, will give Saskatchewan's 12 athletes and 5 support adults an opportunity to train and learn with a different group of athletes and coaches while building relationships within the biathlon community. Sask Winter Games

Biathlon Sask is pleased to announce that Biathlon has been officially accepted to be a part of the Saskatchewan Winter Games in 2026. The multisport games experience is critical to the development of Saskatchewan biathletes as they move on to compete at Canada Games and even international racing. Past Sask Winter Games alumni include Logan Pletz, Janice Grundhal, Matthew Hudec, Michio Green, Hanne Stadnyk - all medalists at National Championships in the Senior Mens/Womens categories.

It is also an important development opportunity for coaches and officials in the province to prepare for higher level competitions. Coaches at the Games are expected to be Competition-Introduction certified, and officials have the opportunity to officiate different race formats than might be seen in a typical SWF Cup race series. Coach Doug Sylvester has attended 8 Sask Games in total going back to 1981 in Prince Albert as a volunteer.

Each district is allowed to send teams of three boys and three girls, one coach and one manager. The location of the games is yet to be decided.

Canada Winter Games Announced - Quebec City

Quebec City has been nominated as the host city for Canada Games in 2027. Saskatchewan is on track to have a very competitive team building on medal performances at the previous three games.

Changes to Race Formats

You will see some changes to Biathlon Canada race formats this season which are mainly to have three developmental categories for under 17 athletes who do not wish to race as senior boys or girls or youth and four masters categories. Another change is shorter penalty loops for masters. There is a full flouro ban for waxing and a waxing protocol for Nationals.

Biathlon Canada "Tryout" License

Biathlon Canada has created a "Tryout" License that lets a person join and try biathlon for one day to see if they like it or not. Eco (Laser) Rifles - to Biathlon Saskatchewan

Biathlon Saskatchewan has access to 6 brand new eco aims rifles to utilize for athlete development. The best thing about these rifles is that they can be set up anywhere that you have 10 meters to set up the rifles (outside or in a gym) and can be shared by multiple athletes (which we think will be extremely useful for bringing biathlon to new communities in the province). How To Register For Biathlon Saskatchewan

New and returning athletes, coaches, officials, supporters and clubs need to register with Biathlon Canada. Registration should be done prior to participation in club practices, camps, races or other events. Note that Biathlon Saskatchewan has the lowest membership fees in the country. Benefits of membership include:

- Provides insurance
- Allows you to access Biathlon Sask equipment, programming and expertise
- Required to Race in Sask Cups
- Required to attend training camps
- Required to attend practices

Equipment Fee (RIFLE FEES DUE NOW!)

Anyone who is borrowing a rifle from Biathlon Saskatchewan is required to pay a rifle rental fee. These fees are due now and can be paid here. Rifle fees that remain unpaid run the risk of being reassigned to other athletes.


Coach's Tip of The Month – Dryfiring Works

Biathletes must understand that a key component of great shooting success is related to dryfiring. You don't have to do it for long (10-15 minutes per session) but you need to do often (5 days per week)

It is best to do this at a time that makes it easy to do each day. (Same time – same place) so that dryfiring gets to be a habit.

Intro To Competition – Part 2 Workshop

Biathlon Sask will be hosting an in-person Intro to Competition-Part 2 Workshop (either at Saskatoon Wildlife Biathlon or Qu'Appelle Valley Nordic) on Oct 14 and 15. Part 2 will cover topics such as the equipment used for biathlon, supporting the athlete in training, and analyzing technique, with shooting being a major focus. Completion of this workshop is one of the requirements to become a Competition-Introduction certified coach and is free for Biathlon Sask coaches and will be facilitated by Sheri and Doug. Reminder about Background Checks for Those Working with Youth

Biathlon Saskatchewan reminds all its clubs and members of its policy about background checks. Any person working with participants who are under the age of 18 must have a Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Search completed once every two years.
